§ 18.2-388. **Profane swearing and intoxication in public**; penalty; transportation of public inebriates to detoxification center.

If any person profanely curses or swears or is intoxicated in public, whether such intoxication results from alcohol, narcotic drug or other intoxicant or drug of whatever nature, he shall be deemed guilty of a **Class 4 misdemeanor**. In any area in which there is located a court-approved detoxification center a law-enforcement officer may authorize the transportation, by police or otherwise, of public inebriates to such detoxification center in lieu of arrest; however, no person shall be involuntarily detained in such center

“Intoxicated” means a condition in which a person has drunk enough alcoholic beverages to observably affect his manner, disposition, speech, muscular movement, general appearance or behavior.

18.2-119. Trespass after having been forbidden to do so

If any person without authority of law goes upon or **remains upon the lands, buildings or premises of another, or any portion or area thereof, after having been forbidden to do so, either orally or in writing**, by the owner, lessee, custodian or other person lawfully in charge thereof, or after having been forbidden to do so by a sign or signs posted by such persons or by the holder of any easement or other right-of-way authorized by the instrument creating such interest to post such signs on such lands, structures, premises or portion or area thereof at a place or places where it or they may be reasonably seen, or if any person, whether he is the owner, tenant or otherwise entitled to the use of such land, building or premises, goes upon, or remains upon such land, building or premises after having been prohibited from doing so by a court of competent jurisdiction by an ex parte order issued pursuant to § 20-103, and after having been served with such order, he shall be guilty of a **Class 1 misdemeanor**.

18.2-415. **Disorderly conduct** in public places.

A person is guilty of **disorderly conduct** if, with the intent to cause public inconvenience, annoyance or alarm, or recklessly creating a risk thereof, he:

In any street, highway, public building, or while in or on a public conveyance, or public place engages in conduct having a direct tendency to cause acts of violence by the person or persons at whom, individually, such conduct is directed

The person in charge of any such building, place, conveyance, meeting, operation or activity **may eject there from any person who violates any provision of this section, with the aid, if necessary, of any persons who may be called upon for such purpose.**

A person violating any provision of this section shall be guilty of a **Class 1 misdemeanor.**

18.2-460. Obstructing justice; penalty.

If any person without just cause **knowingly obstructs** a judge, magistrate, justice, juror, attorney for the Commonwealth, witness, any **law-enforcement officer**, or animal control officer employed pursuant to § 3.2-6555 in the performance of his duties as such or fails or refuses without just cause to cease such obstruction when requested to do so by such judge, magistrate, justice, juror, attorney for the Commonwealth, witness, law-enforcement officer, or animal control officer employed pursuant to § 3.2-6555, he shall be guilty of a **Class 1 misdemeanor**.

18.2-414.1. Obstructing members of rescue squad in performance of mission; penalty.

Any person or persons who **unreasonably or unnecessarily obstruct a member or members of a rescue squad**, whether governmental, private or volunteer, in the performance of their rescue mission or who shall fail or refuse to cease such obstruction or move on when requested to do so by a member of a rescue squad going to or at the site of a rescue mission, shall be guilty of a **Class 2 misdemeanor**.

4.1-305. Purchasing or possessing alcoholic beverages unlawful in certain cases

- A. **No person to whom an alcoholic beverage may not lawfully be sold under § 4.1-304 shall consume, purchase or possess, or attempt to consume, purchase or possess, any alcoholic beverage,**

- C. Any person found guilty of a violation of this section shall be guilty of a **Class 1 misdemeanor**; and upon conviction, (i) such person shall be ordered to pay a mandatory minimum fine of \$500 or ordered to perform a mandatory minimum of 50 hours of community service as a condition of probation supervision and (ii) **the license to operate a motor vehicle in the Commonwealth of any such person age 18 or older shall be suspended for a period of not less than six months and not more than one year;**

§ 4.1-311. Limitations on transporting lawfully purchased alcoholic beverages; penalty.

- A. The transportation of alcoholic beverages lawfully purchased in the Commonwealth in excess of the following limits is prohibited except in accordance with Board regulations:
1. Wine and beer, no limitation.
 2. Alcoholic beverages other than wine and beer, **three gallons**, provided that not more than one gallon thereof shall be in containers holding less than one-fifth of a gallon. If any part of the alcoholic beverages being transported is held in metric-sized containers, the three-gallon limitation shall be construed to be 12 liters, and not more than 4 liters thereof shall be in containers smaller than 750 milliliters.
- C. Any person transporting alcoholic beverages in violation of this section shall be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor

§ 18.2-387. Indecent exposure.

Every person who intentionally makes an obscene display or exposure of his person, or the private parts thereof, in any public place, or in any place where others are present, or procures another to so expose himself, shall be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor. No person shall be deemed to be in violation of this section for breastfeeding a child in any public place or any place where others are present

Sec. 10-124 Urinating or Defecating in Public.

A. It shall be unlawful for any person to urinate or defecate within public view upon any street, highway, sidewalk, ground, **public place or place where others are present**, except in a bathroom, restroom or other facility designed for such purposes.

B. Any person violating the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a class 4 misdemeanor.

18.2-57. Assault and battery.

C. In addition, if any person commits an assault or an assault and battery against another knowing or having reason to know that such other person is a judge, a **law-enforcement officer** as defined hereinafter, a correctional officer as defined, a person employed by the Department of Corrections directly involved in the care, treatment or supervision of inmates in the custody of the Department, a firefighter as defined , or a volunteer firefighter or lifesaving or rescue squad member who is a member of a bona fide volunteer fire department or volunteer rescue or emergency medical squad regardless of whether a resolution has been adopted by the governing body of a political subdivision recognizing such firefighters or members as employees, engaged in the performance of his public duties, **such person is guilty of a Class 6 felony, and, upon conviction, the sentence of such person shall include a mandatory minimum term of confinement of six months.**
